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DRESS CODE POLICY

The following is the expected dress code:

Gentlemen:

- Dress shirt
- Dress trousers [sweater, blazer, suit, tie (optional)]
- Formal shoes (no slippers, loafers, sneakers, sports shoes etc.)
- Neat and Proper haircut
- No hats or caps are allowed.

Ladies:

- A dress / suit / dress slacks, or skirt (strictly below the knee) with a blouse or sweater
- Formal shoes, heels / boots are all acceptable attire. (no slippers, loafers, sneakers, sports shoes etc.)
- No hats or caps are allowed.

NOTE: *Delegates of Lok Sabha, HCC, and FCC are allowed to dress according to their personalities while still following the general guidelines for dress code. (e.g.: no sleeveless garments, skirts shouldn't go above the knees, etc.)*

- Participants who are dressed inappropriately for any event will be asked to change into more appropriate attire on the day itself.
- If a participant fails to adhere to the dress code on both days, they will be asked to leave the conference.
- ID cards are mandatory on both days. No one will be permitted inside the school without their respective ID cards on any basis.
- Walking barefoot or in socks is strictly prohibited.

GOSSIP BOX

The gossip box is a lighthearted break-time activity that aims to bring delegates together in an entertaining and relaxed manner, where members of the council are allowed to anonymously submit chits or dares which may be enacted upon chair's discretion.

The following are the rules for the gossip box:

- The chair reserves the right to disregard any chit that they deem inappropriate.
- The chits must not contain any derogatory, discriminatory or harmful language.
- Obscene forms of dancing are strictly prohibited.
- Dares that can cause injury or harm are not permitted.
- Gossip Box may only be done during the break-time and must not interfere with council proceedings.

Failure to comply with the above may prompt a warning, or the council session may be canceled upon the Directors' decision.

VIDEOGRAPHY/PHOTOGRAPHY

While we encourage delegates to capture memories, we also apply strict guidelines on the content which can be shared through social media to maintain professionalism and respect for all participants.

- During the council session, photography and videography are strictly prohibited.
- Only authorised media and press teams are allowed to capture photos and videos inside the council.
- Photography/Videography is permitted during council breaks, lunch, opening ceremony, and closing ceremony.
- Any misleading, defamatory or inappropriate content posted on social media related to the conference or the participants is strictly prohibited.
- Polaroids are permitted, however the BMUNIS team and faculty are not responsible for any damage or loss of such items.

PUNCTUALITY

Punctual arrival is appreciated to ensure the smooth running of the conference schedule. If you arrive late, you will be issued a warning. In the case of unforeseeable circumstances, kindly ask your respective chair to inform the Head of Security at the earliest.
